# WORDS FROM THE WILDERNESS

A few months ago I constructed a field-stone cross in the pasture. Geologists think that this area of Wisconsin was formed by glaciers many years ago. Could be, as I surely was not in want for building material of all shapes and sizes. The placement of the stone cross was on a hillside, at the base of a wooden cross, so as to mimic a shadow of that cross. Even as I set about to gather the stones, some from the field, some from the rock pile, Father God began to download on me. According to the Word, we are all living stones. Some of us He gathers from the pasture of life, a normal life without anything special or dramatic. Just sitting in some field when He picks us up for His purposes. Others He retrieves from the heap of life's rock pile. These are the ones who have been discarded into some pile because of some problem; they got in the way and were not usable how or where they were. These, too, He hand-selects and carries them to the Cross. Wherever He gathers from, their usefulness must begin at the Cross. As I began to set the rocks in place, he assured me that I didn't need to clean them off but that over time the rain (the Holy Spirit) will come to wash them off (with the Word, Ephesians 5:25). I am overwhelmed as I see how we really are like all these rocks. Some are bigger, some smaller. Some are round and smooth; others are rough with jagged edges. Some lightly colored, some are dark, and some are a mixture. Yet... (cont. on page 3)

(cont. from page 2) ... all have a place, a purpose, and a use. Each is fitted together to form as it were a shadow of the cross. Again, according to the Word (1 Peter 2:4,5), we are fitted together.

We have (or should have) no say in where in His design He chooses to put us, or who He puts us next to. Some of the larger rocks are placed as foundation stones. The smaller stones placed along side of these are no less important, for they offer support necessary to keep the large ones in place, especially in the steep (difficult) areas (of life).

I would not suggest that my labor is a work of art. But as I stood looking at this stone cross, the Holy Spirit reminded me of the words the Psalmist penned: "How good it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." (Psalms 133:1) A few weeks later I had occasion to return to the site. Even in that short time, the image of the Cross being still visible, had begun to be encroached upon by weeds and pasture grasses. Again the Holy Spirit reminded me how readily and easily the normal weeds and grass of the pastures of our life grow up. Unattended, they cover up and obfuscate the image of the Cross. Perhaps this is what Jesus was alluding to when He told us we needed to take up (embrace/care for) our cross daily. (Luke 9:23)

# Did you know?

My dad grew up on a farm in Forest, WI, till the age of 14. At that time he began going to a preministry training school in St. Paul, MN. While there as a young adult, he met his future wife, my mother. Since I had grandparents and aunts and uncles who were farmers, I grew to love being on the farm with them and their machinery and animals. I spent many summer's weeks being a "city boy" farmer. One summer I even worked on a farm near LeSeur, MN.

In the summer of 1947, at the age of 14, I had the privilege of going to Luther Park Bible Camp near Chetek, WI. The Word of God was used by the Holy Spirit to challenge us to commit our life to follow Jesus. On the last night of camp the Holy Spirit broke through the hardness of my heart as the Gospel was shared by the evangelist of the week, W.E. Klawitter, my own dad. I rejoice in the many blessings that are mine as a child of the King of Kings, my Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

That summer, at the age of 14, I purchased with money I had earned on my paper route, my first automobile, for \$40: a 1932 Chevrolet. I had a hard time waiting to get my driver's license, which I got three days after my 15th birthday. (Guess who was asked to drive to baseball games, etc., because he was the only one in the class who owned a car?)

In the fall I was privileged to have my parents enroll me for my high school education at a Christian School, Minnehaha Academy in Minneapolis, MN. Where Bible Classes, Chapel services, Christian teachers and many fellow students encouraged me in my walk with Jesus.

Fast forward – to the beginning of my junior year. I was introduced to a sophomore girl. I soon discovered that we enjoyed doing things together and also that her parents had gone to Minnehaha in the 1920's, and that they were farmers near Grantsburg, WI. That fall I was invited to meet her family and spend the weekend at the family farm where I could help with chores and fieldwork. I was also taken to see another 93 acre farm about 5 miles away which was rolling hills and woodland, used for pasture and hay fields. This farm was known as "the old Brask farm" which her family had purchased in 1940. Little did I realize what God had planned for this farm!
